





「臺灣國中、小英語教育多元評量」-國際研討會議

近年來,亞洲各國普遍於國小教育中實施英語教學課程;於中學英文課堂中也融入了溝通式的英語教學法,同時任務導向式的語言學習也逐漸地成爲趨勢!可惜各地國中、小英語課堂中的「評量」方式並非總是與現今英語教學的新面貌並駕齊驅。因此,研發並實施適合國中、小學生程度及符合溝通式英語教學精神的多元評量方式是有其需要性!

針對國內國中、小英語教育,符合「九年一貫課程」精神的「多元評量模式」近年來越來越受到 重視。英國文化協會與教育部自民國98年9月起共同執行為期一年的「國中、小英語教育多元評 量計畫」,此行動研究計畫採用個案研究法,包括收集與分析各種數據資料,以辨認出教師在實 施多元評量教學上的困難,繼而提供教師具體教學建議。

此次國際研討會議為研究計畫的最後階段,除了邀請到英國指導顧問 Dr. Caroline Linse 發表研究 成果報告外,同時也將邀請到亞洲各國專家分享當地實施英語教育多元評量之相關議題;此外, 為能使英語教師學習更多實用的多元評量教學方式,研討會議中也將舉辦八場工作坊,歡迎全國 有興趣的教育學者、國中、小英語教師一起來共襄盛舉!

Conference Speakers

Dr Caroline Teresa Linse



EdM, EdD - Harvard Graduate School of Education, Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts Senior Lecturer

Dr Caroline Linse is a Senior Lecturer in TESOL at Queen's University, Belfast and holds a doctorate in Education from the Harvard Graduate School of Education. She teaches in both the Master's and Doctoral TESOL programs at Queens. Her interests lie in implicational linguistics which is a multidisciplinary approach to language learning and teaching. This theoretical orientation is the basis for examining the ramifications of language learning in a variety of different contexts and is based on different types of assessment. She is especially interested in assessment in both ESL and EFL classrooms; parent involvement and developmentally appropriate instruction.

Caroline has lived and worked in South Korea and has also worked with teachers in Taiwan. She is a frequent presenter at international conferences including TESOL and IATEFL. Caroline is the author of a host of publications, including assessment instruments for ELT. She is author of, Practical English Language Teaching: Young Learners, an EFL methodology text, is part of a series edited by David Nunan and published by McGraw. She along with Elly Schottman have written courses for young children learning English.

Prof Vincent W. Chang



After receiving his Ph.D. in Linguistics from the University of Florida, Professor Chang came back to teach at the Department of English, National Taiwan Normal University in 1986. Over the past 23 years, he has taught courses and conducted research related to general linguistics, discourse analysis, ELT methodology, language testing and evaluation, among others.

From August 1999 to July 2005, Professor Chang served as Chairman of the Department of English and Director of the English Training Center, NTNU, and from August 2005 to July

2008, he was Dean of the College of Liberal Arts, NTNU. Over the years, he has been in charge of several important research projects for the Ministry of Education, the College Entrance Examination Center, the Technical Colleges and Universities Examination Center, and the Advisory Committee on the Basic Competence Test.

Dr WonKey Lee



WonKey LEE is a professor at Seoul National University of Education, Korea. His academic interests lie in English language assessment, primary ELT and educational policy. He is one of the key pioneers and leaders in the Korean ELT. He has been involved in a wide variety of national educational projects and policies. He was involved in creating the national curriculum for primary ELT in Korea and in revising the English national curriculum three times. He is an English textbook writer as well as a test item writer of the national English test. He is deeply involved in making and enforcing the current government's Public School English Education Reinforcement Policy in a variety of aspects.

- served as a visiting scholar at UCLES(UK), and at UPenn (USA)
- working as a policy advisor to the Minster of Education in Korea, being involved in a variety of English language policy-making in Korea
- currently serving as a professor at Seoul National University of Education, Korea

Dr Sheila Luo



Shaoqian Luo received Ph.D. in Applied English Linguistics at the Chinese University of Hong Kong. She is currently a professor in the English Department, and a member of the Language Testing and Assessment Research Center in the School of Foreign Languages and Literatures, Beijing Normal University. Her research interests include task-based teaching and learning and language assessment, and teacher development. She has

published a number of journal articles and books on task-based approach to language teaching and learning and assessment, classroom assessment, formative assessment. She has also been one of the chief editors of English textbooks for senior high school students used nationwide (2002-2010) for middle school students. She has been involved in several projects on language assessment (e.g., Standards-based English Assessment for Schools), teacher development (STEPSS project, Ministry of Education, 2005-present), and task-based language teaching granted by the Ministry of Education.

Dr David Carless is Associate Professor and Head of the Division of English Language Education in the Faculty of Education, University of Hong Kong. His main research interest is in how assessment can be reconfigured to stimulate productive student learning. Within this theme, he has carried out projects in Hong Kong schools, as well as in the tertiary sector. In relationship to assessment in higher education, in 2006 he co-authored a book (with Gordon Joughin, Ngar-Fun Liu and Associates) entitled, How assessment supports learning: lea 老師 rning-oriented assessment in action, published by Hong Kong University Press. With respect to schooling, his forthcoming book is entitled: From testing to productive student learning: implementing formative assessment in Confucian-heritage settings to be published by Routledge in early 2011.

Jamie Gibbings works as a teacher and teacher-trainer at British Council Singapore. He is a certified tutor for the Cambridge Young Learner Extension to CELTA, and has presented at conferences for the International Association of Teachers of English as a Foreign Language.
